Prompt Pick-Up

Can I remind all parents that to keep everyone on site safe children do need to be picked up during the allotted windows of time in the afternoon. The gates open at 3.10pm and Infant pupils can be collected between 3.10 and 3.30pm. Junior Children can be collected between 3.20pm and 3.40pm. Any children that have not been collected by these points will be transferred to FOSBACS and a charge will be incurred. Thank you to all parents for their co-operation in this.



Guidance from the Department for Education—Out-of-School Settings

The new guidance from the DfE for the wider opening of schools starting on March 8th asks that we should "advise parents and carers that they should be limiting their use of multiple out-of-school settings, and should as far as possible only be sending their children to one out-of-school setting, in addition to school, in order to minimise mixing." We would ask all parents to think carefully about the arrangements for their children outside of school in order to keep the pupils and staff as safe as possible. Many thanks.

Sutton Coldfield Charitable Trust—School Clothing Grant



Every year Sutton Coldfield Charitable Trust run a scheme whereby any parents who reside within the Sutton Coldfield boundaries can apply for a grant of up to £100 per child to help purchase school uniform. This is dependent upon whether the parents are in receipt of Income Support, Job Seekers Allowance, Employment Support Allowance, Child Tax Credit, Working Tax Credit or Universal Credit. If you think you may be eligible for this scheme

then please contact Mrs Johnson in the Junior Office (Tel: 674 2685) and she will be able to provide you with a form to fill in. Please note the deadline for completed applications is Monday 22nd March so please don't delay in requesting your form.

Free School Meals Funding / Pupil Premium

We are aware that we have some families who have decided not to apply for Free School Meals simply because their children are in the Infant Department and therefore get a free school dinner funded by the Government anyway. We would encourage these families still to apply as the extra funding that then comes into school can benefit their children in many ways, not just in terms of a free school meal, through something called Pupil Premium. To see if you would qualify for Free School Meals just go to our website, click on the parent tab at the top of the page and follow the links to meals. This contains a link for you to apply. Please be assured that this process is all totally confidential.

School Closures in relation to Elections—May 6th 2021

I would like to inform all parents of an unavoidable closure for elections on Thursday 6th May 2021 for the election of the West Midlands Police Commissioner & Mayor of Birmingham. The school will be used as a polling station from 7am until 10pm and with members of the public accessing the site all day safeguarding procedures do not allow us to open the school to children. I have requested that the school not be used in this way this year, but have been told by the Local Authority that arrangements cannot be changed.




Acorns And Superstars

Asymptomatic Testing Information

For parents and adults in households with children at school or college

NHS Test and Trace announced earlier this week, that all adults in households with school and college age children without symptoms can now access regular rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing.

Test kits can either be collected or ordered online, as set out below. Tests are fast, easy and completely free. There are different ways for a household, childcare or support bubble to collect their test to take at home, twice-weekly:

- Through your employer, if they offer testing to employees.
- By collecting a home test from a local test site—anyone aged 18 or over can collect 2 packs of 7 tests.
- By ordering a home test kit online—please do not order online if you can access testing through other routes, this frees up home delivery for those who need it most.

If you have any queries about the tests, and you live in England, please call 119 (free from mobiles and landlines). Lines are open every day from 7am to 11pm.

Free Government Funded Training Courses

We have had information passed to us this week from a group called 'Aim' and they are offering government funded adult training courses in a wide variety of subjects and topics. They are structured as below:

- The qualifications are all question based, with interactive workbooks to help answer the questions.
- 6 weeks to be completed, taking on average between 15-25 hours in total to do.
- Online platform to complete the qualification, therefore a laptop or computer will be needed.
- 2 workbooks to be completed, with them needing to be submitted at the 3 and 6 week stage.
- Tutor support throughout for any help and guidance.

ICT Tip of the Week

A good way to create a strong and memorable password is to use three random words. Numbers and symbols can still be used if needed, for example 3redhousemonkeys27! Be creative and use words memorable to you, so that people can't guess your password. Your social media accounts can give away vital clues about yourself so don't use words such as your child's name or favourite sports team which are easy for people to guess. Cyber criminals are very smart and know many of the simple substitutions we use such as 'Pa55word!" which utilises symbols to replace letters.

Never use the following personal details for your password:

• Current partner's name • Child's name • Other family members' name • Pet's name • Place of birth • Favourite holiday • Something related to your favourite sports team.
