Key Stage 2 SATs Week

The week beginning Monday 9^{th} May is an important week for our Year 6 pupils, as they will be taking on the exciting challenge of their Key Stage 2 SATs.

Can I remind all Year 6 parents that it is vitally important that all children are in school every day and on time so that we can all give them the very best opportunity to shine and show off their talents. I know how hard the children and staff have been working in Year 6 and I'm sure they will all try their very best.

COVID 19—Update

The Government has issued new guidance that comes into effect from today. Children who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home. Once the temperature has gone and they are well enough they can return to school. Children with a positive COVID-19 test should stay at home for 3 full days. They can return to school after this if they have no temperature.

EYFS Readathon

We would like to ask our Reception families to raise money for two very special items in their Reception classrooms. 

When should we bring our project in?


Please bring your entries to school on **Tuesday 26th April** 2022.
