### Offers of Reception Places for September 2024

For all parents who have a child who will be starting school this coming September, if you applied online on time, and provided an email address, you should have received an email you on Tuesday 16 April 2024 to tell you which primary school your child has been offered a place in. The Local Authority will also send you a formal offer letter posted by 1st class post on Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> April 2024, which you will receive at some point from the 17<sup>th</sup> onwards. The Local Authority ask you to allow at least three working days for your letter to arrive. The offer letter will explain how to accept or refuse the offer that has been made.

If you have been offered a place in Reception here at Four Oaks for September, then let me take this first opportunity to welcome you! As soon as the Local Authority send us a list of names our own induction process will kick in, and you will soon know about all of the exciting events we have planned for the Summer Term to get your children prepared for a successful start at school after the summer holidays.



### Class Photographs

A reminder that on Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> April class photographs of all of the children will be taken in school. If your child is due to have PE that day they will need to bring in their PE kit to get changed into. We hope to see lots of smart children, please ensure that your child is not wearing trainers. We will send details of how parents can order these photographs if they wish in due course.

### School Closure - Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> May

Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> May will see the Police and Crime Commissioner elections in England and Wales. The Police and Crime Commissioner in Birmingham makes sure that the local police are meeting the needs of our local communities, and as a school we have no choice in our school building being used as a polling station. We apologise to all parents for this inconvenience.

### Staff Training Days

A reminder that our 4<sup>th</sup> staff training day will take place on Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> May and school will be closed to pupils on this day. Our 5<sup>th</sup> and final staff training day of the year will be on the very last day of the Summer Term which is Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> July and school will also be closed on this day.

### National School Rebuilding Programme

I can now let parents know that we have completed a series of 'Client Engagement Meetings' with the DFE and the building contractors who have won the tender to build our new school over the next couple of years. In these meetings we all came together over a period of 6 weeks to work out what the new building will look like both externally and internally. The contractors have now gone away to prepare their planning submission to send to the planning department at Birmingham City Council. This means that during this term they will also arrange for a community meeting where all parents and residents will be invited into school over the course of one day to view the plans and ask questions. As a school we truly appreciate that this is a community project which will affect all of our families and local residents, and that it has to be right for everyone and provide Four Oaks Primary School with a positive future where the children will be at the heart of everything that happens on site. 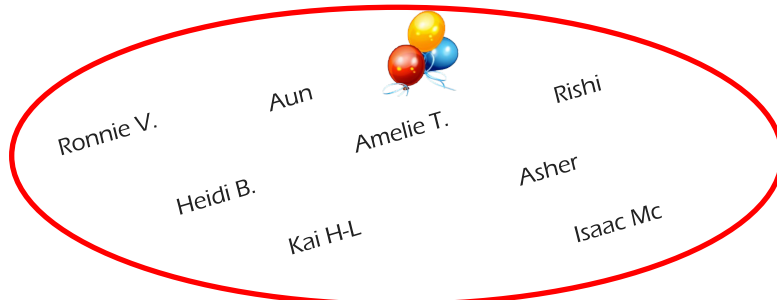
