

ICT Tip of the Week

Ticket Fraud has been in the news recently. Action Fraud reports that £6.7 million was lost to ticket fraud in 2023 in the UK.

Only buy tickets from the venue's box office, official promoter, or a well-known ticketing website.

Do not pay for tickets by bank transfer. Credit card or payment services such as PayPal give you a better chance of recovering the money if you become a victim of fraud.

The password you use for your email account should always be different to the password you use for other online services. If fraudsters have access to email accounts they can easily change passwords for other sites.

Check the reseller is a member of STAR? If they are, the company has signed up to their strict governing standards. For more information visit star.org.uk/buy_safe
